## Proposed ByLaw\SOP changes

### "Creation of Arms Custodian Position for Management of and Regular Inventory of Club Assets"

This is to address issues that have been raised by the implementation of WA State initiatives and to provide the Club a better way to manage, purchase and sell Club Assets.

See the end of the Shotwad for the complete proposed change.

This proposed change will be voted on at the September General Membership Meeting.

Note, Section numbering is not accurate.

### August 20 & 21st 9 AM to 4 PM at MRC Club House

All individuals born after Jan. 1, 1972 must show proof of hunter education certification before purchasing their first Washington hunting license. Qualifying individuals participating in the Hunter Education Deferral Program are exempted from this requirement for one year. If you already have a valid hunter education training certificate, just show it to a license vendor to purchase a hunting license. Hunter education training certificates can be from Washington or another state. Please note that an out-of-state license is not the same as a hunter education certificate. There is no minimum age required to enroll in hunter education. However, students 17 years of age and younger are required to complete an in-person assessment through either a traditional class or field skills evaluation for the online course. ### Pistol Qualification

**On Going Qualifications** are every Tuesday at Noon

**Minimum Caliber** 380 Semi Auto | 38 for Revolver

**Approximate time** for safety review & qualification 2hrs or less

Anyone wishing to use the outdoor pistol range will need to participate in a short basic pistol review and pass a live fire qualifying test. The qualification will require that the shooter at the outdoor pistol range hit 20 out of 20 shots on a 14" X 14" target at 7 yards. Minimum caliber to qualify with is 380 for Semi Auto and 38 for revolver. After you qualify, you can shoot anything you want as long as the SOP's permit it. There is no time limit and shooters are advised to practice before hand. Shooter will get a 5 shot warm up if they so desire before the qualification. If a shooter fails to make 20 hits on paper, a second round will be offered. If the shooter still does not qualify, a reshoot at a later time will be offered after range practice with an instructor. 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### **Learning Opportunities with the NRA Instructors:**

Various NRA classes are offered throughout the year at the Marysville Rifle Club. Everyone, including the public, is welcome take these classes. If you are interested in learning a new skill or know any new gun owners, they can sign up through the NRA website, accessed through Google ("NRA Classes Near Me") or at <https://www.nrainstructors.org/search.aspx> Select the classes you are interested in & press search. It is best to search using the MRC zip code of 98223 to ensure you get all the classes. For questions contact Scott Bigger at PH 360-403-5922 or email at [scottbigger50@comcast.net](mailto:scottbigger50@comcast.net) There is a discount for MRC members & all funds from these classes are donated to the MRC. All classes start at 8 AM. Cost is \$75 for the public & \$50 for MRC members. Instructor classes will be coming out in second half of 2022 if you are interested in becoming a certified NRA instructor. See below for the near-term class schedule.

#### **Saturday August 6th– Basic Shotgun**

Teaches the basic knowledge, skills, & attitude for the safe & proper use of a shotgun in shooting a moving target. This course is at least ten-hours long & includes classroom & range time learning how to shoot shotguns at moving targets. Students learn NRA's rules for safe gun handling; shotgun parts & operation; shotgun shell components; shotgun shell malfunctions; shooting fundamentals; range rules; shooting at straight away & angled targets; cleaning; & continued opportunities for skill development. Students will receive the Basics of Shotgun Shooting handbook, NRA Gun Safety Rules brochure, Winchester/NRA Marksmanship Qualification booklet, take a Basics of Shotgun Shooting Student Examination, & receive a course completion certificate.

#### **Saturday August 27th Metallic Cartridge Reloading**

Teaches beginning reloaders the basic knowledge, skills, & attitude necessary to safely reload metallic cartridges. This course is eight hours in length & is conducted in a classroom. Each student is taught reloading safety, centerfire cartridge components, how to use the reloading manual & reloading data, equipment, & the metallic cartridge reloading process. Students will receive the NRA Guide to Reloading handbook, the Basic Reloading Student Exam, a course completion certificate, NRA Gun Safety Rules brochure, a Basic Firearm Training Program brochure, & a Course Evaluation form.

#### **Saturday August 30th – Shotgun Shell Reloading**

Teaches beginning reloaders the basic knowledge, skills, and attitude necessary to safely reload shotgun shells. This course is six hours in length and is conducted in a classroom. Each student is taught reloading safety; shotgun shell components; using the reloading manual and reloading data; equipment; and the shotgun shell reloading process. Students will receive the NRA Guide to Reloading handbook, the Basic Reloading Student Exam, a course completion certificate, NRA Gun Safety Rules brochure, a Basic Firearm Training Program brochure and a Course Evaluation form.

#### **Saturday September 3<sup>rd</sup> – Basic Pistol**

Course topics include gun safety rules, proper operation of revolvers & semi-automatic pistols, ammunition knowledge & selection, pistol selection & storage, shooting fundamentals, pistol inspection & maintenance, marksmanship, & shooting range safety. Additionally, students will complete live fire training & a nationally standardized shooting qualification while on the range with an NRA Certified Instructor. Students will receive the NRA Guide: Basics of Pistol Shooting handbook, take a Basics of Pistol Shooting Student Examination, & receive a course completion certificate bearing the signature of the NRA Secretary & your NRA Certified Instructor.

#### **Saturday September 17<sup>th</sup> – Refuse to be a victim**

This is not a firearms instruction course & does not include instruction in physical combat self-defense. Seminars teach common weaknesses that criminals may take advantage of, & a variety of corrective measures that are practical, inexpensive, & easy to follow." The seminar includes classroom instruction on criminal psychology, automobile crimes, cyber safety, home security, & a variety of crime prevention strategies including carjack avoidance techniques, use of personal safety devices, & more. Students receive the Refuse To Be A Victim® student handbook, NRA Refuse To Be A Victim® brochure, NRA Become A Refuse To Be A Victim® Instructor Brochure, Refuse To Be A Victim® Firearms Supplement, & a course completion certificate.

#### **September 24<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup> – NRA Basic CCW**

Two Day class, Topics covered: Firearm Safety, selecting a Pistol for Self Defense, Defensive Ammo Selection, Basic Defensive Pistol Skills, Drawing from Concealment, Loading & Stopping Remediation, Mindset, Carry Modes & Concealment, Firearm Cleaning, Sport Shooting & Activities. Additional information provided with registration.

## 2.3. **Voting Member Classifications**

2.3.1 Members of the following classes of MRC membership... ..during their first calendar year or membership. Every voting member in good standing shall be deemed to be an Authorized Person (AP) of the Club and, as such, is authorized to use MRC firearms when deemed appropriate by the AC, ACC or Officer and subject to the temporary transfer protocol set forth in 21.5.6.

## 2.4. **Non-Voting Member Classification**

2.4.1 The following classes of club members... ..but may not vote, make motions, nor hold office. Every person classified in this section that is in good standing shall be deemed to be an Authorized Person (AP) of the Club and, as such, is authorized to use MRC firearms when deemed appropriate by the AC, ACC or Officer and subject to the temporary transfer protocol set forth in 21.5.6.

## 2.5. **Junior Members**

2.5.1 The initiation fee shall be waived... ..Verification required. Every Junior Member in good standing shall be deemed to be an Authorized Person (AP) of the Club and, as such, is authorized to use MRC firearms when deemed appropriate by the AC, ACC or Officer and subject to the temporary transfer protocol set forth in 21.5.6.

## 4. **OFFICERS**

### 4.1. **Title of The Club Officers**

4.1.6. The Executive Board shall appoint an interested general member to serve as Arms Custodian (AC). This is a non-voting Officer position. The AC is deemed an agent of the entity with authority to acquire/dispose of firearms in the ordinary course of MRC business, and with authority to temporarily transfer possession of firearms to Authorized Persons (AP) in accordance with RCW 9.41.113(4)(g). No acquisition/disposition of firearms shall be made without the approval of the MRC Executive Board. If a firearm acquisition will exceed \$500.00, than a vote of the general membership is required.

### 4.2. **Terms of Office For Officers And Trustees**

4.2.4. The Arms Custodian serves at the will of the Executive Board.

### 5.7 **Duties of the Arms Custodian.**

5.7.1. The Arms Custodian (AC) shall have general supervision and control over all MRC firearms, including their acquisition and disposition, and over all firearm safes utilized by MRC Committees. The AC's duties are as follows:

- 5.7.1.1 Serve as purchasing agent when the club needs to purchase a firearm through an FFL (and serve in that same capacity when a firearm is gifted to the club); for the FFL background check, in section B of ATF Form 4473, the AC will enter his/her personal information, sign section B and attach a written statement to the 4473 stating under penalty of perjury that the firearm is being acquired for the use of MRC, will be the property of MRC, and will be kept/stored at 1601 Lakewood Rd, Arlington WA 98223. The AC will also complete section D of the 4473 upon receipt of the firearm.
- 5.7.1.2 Maintain control of Master Logbook of all MRC firearms (A&D Boundbook). Record the acquisition and disposition of MRC firearms in Master Logbook as they enter/leave MRC possession (not to include temporary transfers to Authorized Persons).
- 5.7.1.3. Ensure the security and integrity of Committee firearm safes.
- 5.7.1.4. Conduct monthly inventory of firearms assigned to Committee safes and review Committee Logbooks.
- 5.7.1.5. When any MRC firearm needs maintenance/repair, the AC will be responsible for getting the firearm to a qualified gunsmith and will update the Master Logbook when the firearm is sent off-site for and returned from service/repair.
- 5.7.1.6. Immediately report any safety concerns, inventory issues and "temporary transfer" protocol issues to the Executive Board and relevant Committee Chairperson;
- 5.7.1.7. Give monthly report to the Executive Board;

## 21. **COMMITTEE POLICY**

### 21.1 **GENERAL REQUIREMENTS OF ALL MRC STANDING COMMITTEES:**

#### 21.2 **Appointment of Committee Chairpersons.**

- 21.2.1. Committee Chairpersons and Assistant Committee Chairpersons shall be approved by the Executive Board and, once approved, are deemed agents of the entity and shall be designated as Assistant Arms Custodians (AAC).
- 21.2.2. Assistant Arms Custodians (AAC) are authorized by the Executive Board to temporarily transfer possession of firearms to/from actual Discipline Participants (deemed as Authorized Persons - AP) in accordance with RCW 9.41.113(4)(g). An AAC shall only have access to their Committee's gun safe, whereas the AC shall have access to all Committee firearm safes. Committees that currently maintain and control a firearms safe at MRC

are:

- 21.2.2.1. Youth Shotgun;
- 21.2.2.2. Youth Indoor League;
- 21.2.2.3. CMP;
- 21.2.2.4. NRA;
- 21.2.2.5. Hunter Education.

21.5 **Record keeping requirements.**

- 21.5.6. Assistant Arms Custodians (AAC) shall maintain and control a Committee Logbook of the Temporary Transfer of each firearm to/from a discipline participant (Authorized Person - AP). The procedure for temporarily transferring firearms to/from an AP is as follows:
  - 21.5.6.1. The Committee Logbook shall be kept within the Committee gun safe, mounted on the inside of the gun safe's door.
  - 21.5.6.2. On-Site Temporary Transfers. At/near the beginning of a designated on-site event, the AAC shall record within the Committee Logbook which **firearm** was temporarily transferred **to whom**, the **date & time & event**, and shall enter the **AAC's initials**. The AP receiving temporary possession of the firearm shall **sign his/her name**. At/near the end of the event when the AAC recovers possession of the firearm and the firearm is returned to the safe, the **date & time** of return shall be entered into the Logbook along with the **AP's signature** and the **AAC's initials** with any notes regarding condition/needed maintenance, thus terminating the temporary transfer.
  - 21.5.6.3. Off-Site Temporary Transfers. The AAC shall remove the needed firearms from the Committee's gun safe, log them out of the Committee Logbook, leave Logbook in safe, place the firearms in hard-sided locked containers to which only he/she has the key/combo, and transport the firearms to the off-site event. At/near the beginning/end of the designated off-site event, the AAC shall record the temporary transfers to/from each AP as set forth in 21.5.6.2 but doing so instead on an Off-Site Temporary Transfer Logsheet. Upon return to MRC, the AAC shall return the firearms to the safe and shall log them back into the Committee's Logbook with any notes regarding condition/needed maintenance, and shall place the completed Off-Site Temporary Transfer Logsheet inside the Committee Logbook for the AC to collect/review at monthly inspection.
  - 21.5.6.4. Temporary Transfer of firearms to/from APs only occur at the designated range/event where the APs will use the firearms. During the AAC's transportation of firearms to/from off-site events, all ammunition shall be stored separately from the firearms, and all firearms shall be unloaded with bolts opened and chamber flags inserted.
  - 21.5.6.5. When the AAC becomes aware of needed repairs/service to a firearm, the AAC shall alert the AC.
